

Marriages: Marriages are celebrated in the Church where the bride or groom is registered at. When a man and a woman plan to marry each other, they should contact a priest one year in advance and always before the wedding date is set, and before arranging for the reception hall. The engaged are required to attend a Marriage Preparation Course.

Please note: However, if this man or woman has previously gone through any form of civil or religious marriage with another person, the priest is not permitted to set a date for the wedding until the Bishop's office has been consulted. Questions are often being asked about marriages performed outside the Catholic Church by non-Catholic ministers. These are not valid marriages according to the teaching of the Catholic Church, but many can be rectified by simply consulting with your Parish priest to discuss the available options. Sometimes people make decisions without proper information, so if you wish, please contact your Pastor for details or call the Marriage Tribunal at 416-934-3400 ext 300.

ADVENT WREATH - 3rd SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Set a wreath in a place of honour in your home such as a dining table. Each Sunday, gather around and pray together as a family. Light two purple candles and the pink candle this **3rd Sunday of Advent** (Gaudete Sunday) and say a simple prayer such as: Jesus, You are the light of the world. May your light shine brightly so we can see You everywhere. Help us spread Your light and joy by helping the needy around us. Amen.

FOR GOOD CATHOLIC PARENTS TO CONSIDER

You should strive to have your baby baptized within the first few months of his/her life. You should truly consider giving one name of a saint to your child.

10 TIPS FOR RAISING CATHOLIC CHILDREN

- Watch programming about saints with your kids to help establish a love of the saints from an early age.
- 2. **Take** your children to different parishes, especially on occasions when you might be in other communities for sporting events or visiting family and friends.
- 3. **Pray** with your children and for your children. To ensure your kids say their morning and evening prayers, pray with them. Also, keep holy water in the house for blessing them everyday.
- 4. **Discuss** spiritual books you are reading with your children. Talking to your children about books you might be reading sets the example that you are also continuing to learn more about your faith.
- When travelling, make a Catholic Church one
 of your very first stops. Taking children to a
 church as a first stop establishes in their minds
 the universality of the Church, showing them
 the Mass at home is the same Mass in other
 countries.
- 6. **Creatively** establish that saints, the Church and being Catholic is cool. If a faith seems too remote from the life of children they cannot relate to it. So it is important to customize certain aspects of faith to an age-appropriate level. For example, telling a child in Grade 2 that they have their own angel or telling an 8th Grader about martyrdom of some saints.
- 7. **Establish** relationships with families that practice their faith. Children need peer-faith relationships. Children are exposed to so many choices and lifestyles. It is important that children see other children (friends) are serious about their faith. Going to Catholic mother groups, Bible camps, etc. are good options.
- 8. **Place** a religious article, statue, crucifix etc. in every room in your house. These things can help remind us we are Catholic.
- 9. **Have** your house blessed. Invite a priest over when you are having a party, a wedding, lunch.
- 10. **Maintain** parental authority. When it comes to Sunday Mass, there is no choice.

THE STORY OF THE CANDY CANE

A Candymaker wanted to make a candy that would be a witness, so he made the Christmas Candy Cane. He incorporated several symbols for the birth, ministry and death of Jesus Christ.

He began with a stick of pure white hard candy. White to symbolize the Virgin Birth and the sinless nature of Jesus, and hard to symbolize the Solid Rock, the foundation of the Church, and the firmness of the promises of God.

He made the candy in the form of a "J" to represent the precious name of Jesus, who came to earth as our Saviour. It could also represent the staff of the "Good Shepherd" with which he reached down to the ditches of the world to lift out the fallen lambs, who like all sheep have gone astray.

Thinking that the candy was somewhat plain, he stained it with red stripes. He used three small stripes to show the stripes of the scourging Jesus received by which we are healed. The large red stripe was for the blood shed by Christ on the cross so that we could have the promise of eternal life.

Unfortunately, the candy became known as a Candy Cane – a meaningless decoration seen at Christmas time. However, the meaning is still there for those who "have eyes to see and ears to hear." I pray that this symbol will again be used to witness to the Wonder of Jesus and His Great Love that came down at Christmas and remains the ultimate and dominant force in the universe today.

THE CHRISTMAS TREE

A custom Christians borrowed from the pagans is the Christmas tree. This custom was first practiced in Germany in the eighth century after Christ.

St. Boniface, a priest from England, had traveled to Germany to try to convert the pagans. He had some success, but he was having a problem because many of the German people still wanted to worship their pagan gods.

St. Boniface wondered how he could convince the German people that the sacred oak worshiped by them was not a god. He finally decided that he would go into the forest and cut the sacred oak down.

The pagans were very angry with what St. Boniface had done. Now St. Boniface had to worry about how he would be able to calm them down.

Finally, he decided to give them a young evergreen tree as a sign of what Jesus was offering them. Unlike the oak that lost its leaves, the evergreen did not lose its leaves. This would be a sign of the life that Jesus was offering, a life that would never end. A reminder of the gift God offers us in His Son: everlasting life.


