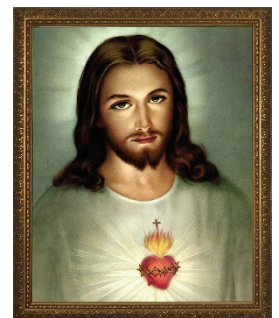

The month of June is the month of the Sacred Heart, and the month of the feast of the nativity of Saint John the Baptist.

John the Baptist is, with Jesus and Mary, the only saint whose birthday we

celebrate solemnly in the Church. For the other saints, we celebrate the day of their birth in heaven. Jesus had said of him that no other man born of a woman was as great as John the Baptist. Jesus, Himself, recognized the greatness and the holiness of this person who more



or less bridged the Old and the New Testament. Indeed, we say of him that he was the last prophet of the Old Testament announcing the coming of the Messiah, and the first prophet of the New Testament who identified Jesus as being the Lamb of God Who takes away the sins of the world.

John the Baptist was not afraid to show Jesus to the world and to shine forth the love of His Sacred Heart. Like he did in building a bridge between the sinful world and the new covenant in Jesus, let us be also, according to our call of baptism in the midst of the world, living bridges between the religious world and the secular world. Let's be the feet and the hands of the Sacred Heart in order to go forth and to act wherever we are. With boldness, let's speak the truth and let's become true instruments of peace. Like John the Baptist who invited the people of his time to stop and reflect and then to get going anew, let's have the courage to stop now, reflect again and adjust our lives to the light of Christ in order to get going anew with the strength of His Spirit. Through our prayer and adoration, through our acts of charity and our attitudes of life, let's consecrate the world to the Sacred Heart of Jesus each day during this month of June and throughout our life.

The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ



Gospel Reflection: This Sunday we celebrate a second solemnity during this period of Ordinary Time in the liturgical calendar. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This day was once called Corpus Christi, which is Latin for "Body of Christ." In the revised Lectionary the name for this day is expanded to reflect more completely our Eucharistic theology. Today's Gospel is taken from the Gospel according to John. The reading is part of a discourse between Jesus and a crowd of Jews. The discourse comes shortly after the miracle of Jesus' multiplication of the loaves and fishes. In John's Gospel, miracles such as this are identified as "signs" through which people come to believe that Jesus is the Son of God. These signs are followed by dialogue, or discourse that interprets and explains the miracle. In John's Gospel, Jesus' multiplication of the loaves is said to have occurred near Passover, thus linking it to the Exodus story and

God's saving action toward the Israelites. Having seen Jesus multiply the loaves and fishes, the crowd pursues him, perhaps seeking more food but also looking for another sign. Jesus tells the crowd that he is the bread of life. He explains that just as God gave the Israelites manna to sustain them in the desert, so now God has sent new manna that will give eternal life. It is in this context that Jesus repeats those words in today's Gospel and tells them again that he is the living bread that came down from heaven. Jesus' words are not well understood by the crowd; they argue that Jesus is not from heaven but born of Mary and Joseph. The crowd also has trouble understanding how Jesus could give them his flesh to eat. Jesus tells them that when they eat his flesh and drink his blood, they will remain forever connected to him. These are difficult words, but they are important because they seek to show us our intimate connection with Jesus. This is the mystery that is at the heart of our Eucharistic theology. In the elements of bread and wine, Jesus' Body and Blood are truly present. When we share in the Body and Blood of Christ, Jesus himself comes to dwell within us. This communion with the Lord makes us one body, brings us eternal life, and sends us forth to be Christ's Body in the world.....Loyola Press
