The theme announced by His Holiness Pope Francis for the 110th World Day of Migrants and Refugees is "God Walks with His People". In his message, Pope Francis encourages us to unite in prayer for all those who have had to leave their land in search of dignified living conditions. May we journey together with them and entrust them to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary as they continue their journey."

## **October – Month of the Most Holy Rosary**

The month of October is traditionally dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary, a most powerful weapon against Satan and all evil spirits. "We do not hesitate to affirm again publicly that we put great confidence in the Holy Rosary for the healing of evils which afflict our times. Not with force,



not with arms, not with human power, but with Divine help obtained through the means of this prayer." Ven. Pope Pius XII

According to an account by fifteenth-century Dominican, Alan de la Roch, Mary appeared to St. Dominic in 1206 after he had been praying and doing severe penances because of his lack of success in combating the Albigensian heresy. Mary praised him for his valiant fight against the heretics and then gave him the Rosary as a mighty weapon, explained its uses and efficacy, and told him to preach it to others. "Since the prayers of the Rosary come from such excellent sources — from Our Lord Himself, from inspired Scripture, and from the Church — it is not surprising that the Rosary is so dear to our Blessed Mother and so powerful with heaven. *by webfeller*


## Indigenous Healing & Reconciliation Fund Collection – October 5/6, 2024
