He reminds us that those who welcome migrants and refugees can also reflect this same hope. His messages ends with a call to entrust all those who journey, and all those who accompany them to the protection of the Virgin Mary, comfort of migrants.

Why October Is the Month of the Rosary?

The Church dedicates October to the Rosary because of a powerful victory that's been linked to Marian intercession. On October 7, we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, a title given to Mary in gratitude for her protection during the Battle of Lepanto in 1571. But this month isn't only about historical memory, it's about personal renewal. This is the time to reset your prayer life and recommit to daily moments with God, through Mary's eyes and heart.

What the Rosary Really Is:

While the Rosary can feel repetitive, it is more than just a set list of prayers. It's a spiritual journey—through the life of Christ, with His Mother as your guide. Each mystery opens a door into Jesus' life and praying them with intention can lead to a profound encounter with His love and mercy. The Rosary teaches you how to:

- Meditate on Scripture through a contemplative lens
- Slow down and make space for God's voice
- Invite Mary into your daily joys, sorrows, and hopes
- Stay rooted in truth when life feels chaotic It's not about perfect focus. It's about showing up with your heart.




